But this calculation won't imply for extreme overclocking; for extreme overclocking, you require more power.

There is nothing like minimum PSU specs for overclocking; it all depends on your system's components and how much you want to overclock them. For minimal CPU or RAM overclocking, you need a Power Supply between 650W to 750W from a reputed brand, including all kinds of protections.

Does the PSU affect maximum overclocking?

So... the tl;dr would be, the PSU (as long as it remains within ATX spec) does not affect maximum overclocking, as long as the CPU/GPU VRMs do not overheat. But it does affect long term component lifespan, especially when overclocking. At least theoretically.
